

## ALLIANCE External Stakeholders Advisory Board Meeting

29<sup>th</sup> September 2017 (09:00-17:00), Cité Internationale Universitaire de Paris, France

The European Radioecology Alliance (ALLIANCE) has established in interaction with two European projects, STAR and COMET, a Strategic Research Agenda (SRA) which provided a long-term vision (20 years) of radioecological research needs. Three challenge areas were defined and 15 associated research priorities. The SRA has been updated several times, taking into account comments from stakeholders and experts and by adding a strategic part focusing on education and training challenges as well as infrastructure-related issues.

Based on the SRA, an initial short-term (5-y) scientific roadmap for radioecology was developed. The SRA and the transitional roadmap are being complemented by topical roadmaps each dealing with specific scientific areas and/or complex environmental.

The ALLIANCE intends to organize an external evaluation and review of these key strategic elements:

- (i) the topical roadmaps that are under implementation,
- (ii) the global roadmap on Radioecology to be produced for the end of November 2017,
- (iii) the present version of the strategic research agenda released in 2013 after incorporation of more than 100 comments from a wide panel of stakeholders.

For the 3 items, reference documents and questions from the ALLIANCE Board of Directors will constitute the basis for the review. All information will be sent to the invited External Stakeholders Advisory Board before 15 of September. Attendees will be, in addition to the External Stakeholders Advisory Board: the Bureau members, the SRA/roadmap and the topical roadmaps leaders. The external Stakeholders Advisory Board will be composed of 5 to 10 persons selected for their skills and advanced experience in research and application fields in Radiation Protection or in regulation.

The expected outcomes of this interactive meeting will be:

For (i): a list of recommendations to enhance the efficiency and the relevancy of each of the topical roadmaps; a list of missing elements; potential identification of other topical roadmap themes.

For (ii): the basic lines underlying the global roadmap, the criteria for establishing priority, timeline and financial needs

For (iii): the new drivers of the next version SRA, plus recommendations for short to medium term priority research.

For (i) to (iii): a list of advices for better interacting with stakeholders and enhancing ALLIANCE visibility

This exercise is also linked with ALLIANCE tasks under WP2 (SRA), WP3 (roadmap development) and WP5 (stakeholder involvement) of the EJP-CONCERT.
